AUMC Welcomes New Youth Director

Patricia "Trish" Bradley has been appointed by the Staff Parish Relations Committee as AUMC's new Youth Director beginning this month. Since 2010, Trish has been the Youth Ministries Director at Pleasureville United Methodist Church, in York, PA., where her activities included Sunday School, Bible study, fundraising, outreach programs, worship leader, and short-term missions Coordinator (New Orleans and Wisconsin Dells). She also worked at a Pennsylvania counseling agency focusing on youth. Previously Trish was Youth and Music Director at Pottsville (PA) Salvation Army Church, camp counselor at Camp Ladore, in Waymart, PA. She served as a youth intern at CrossCurrent Church in Ashburn, VA, and a youth and worship leader in Sussex Salvation Army Community Church, Sussex, New Brunswick Canada. In the late '90s, Fairfax Assembly of God was Trish's home church.



Trish and her husband, Christopher, met at a Christian summer camp in 2007 where both were working as camp counselors. “Therefore, since we are justified by faith,

we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory

of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God’s love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.”

—Romans 5:1-5



As we continue in this season of Pentecost, reflecting on the Holy Spirit descending upon the disciples, I am mindful of just how much they needed the Advocate. As you recall, the disciples were distressed when Jesus died. Now imagine rejoicing that Christ is risen from the dead, only to then watch him depart again and ascend into the clouds. At this point, my jaw would’ve dropped with confusion. Having peace in my heart would not have been one of my first thoughts.

“Since we are justified by faith,” Paul writes, we have been made right before God. We are no longer prisoners of sin and are, therefore, able to have peace. Perhaps you may be enjoying peace in your life with your family or in your job. But I’m sure there have been times, as the disciples experienced, when things don’t seem right. Times when we don’t want to talk to anybody or even leave the house because there’s an element missing in our lives: peace.

One of my mentors, Rev. Saul Espino, a recent retired chaplain of the Global Board of Higher Education and Ministry, shared with me his many experiences in ministry and how he exercised faith in his life. But he also shared times when he was striving to be everything to everybody. His job, ministry, friends, and even family overwhelmed him

at times. His only escape was to go to the movies—not to see the latest blockbuster but to take a nap.

He would laugh with tears in his eyes and say, “Can you believe I had to pay to take a nap?” But he would add that nobody would bother him there, nobody would try to seek him out. He explained that he became overwhelmed because he forgot the most elemental aspect of faith, which is to have peace with yourself and God. When we are missing that peace we can get into a mode of restlessness that affects our everyday lives and, if we are not careful, can damage our family ties.

As you look into your life and keep reading God’s words, I encourage you to have peace within you; to accept your limitations and shortcomings, trusting that God is ever ready to give you peace. Maybe, just like Saul, you need to take a breather, regroup your thoughts, and meditate—or even take a nap at the movies. Whichever way your soul prepares you, allow God’s love to be poured into your heart.

In this season of Pentecost, we are urged to allow the Holy Spirit to act in our lives. We are given the reassurance that peace can be found even when we are facing nerve-racking times because we know, we practice, and we believe in a resurrected Christ—the one who loved us enough to send the Advocate and be with us always.

American Legion - AUMC Memorial Day Ceremony, Monday, May 27

American Legion Post 1976 will make its annual Memorial Day tribute to veterans buried in AUMC Cemetery on Monday, May 27. During the ceremony, an American flag will be implanted in each interred veteran's gravesite. Members of the congregation and the community are invited to witness and participate. Those attending should gather at the cemetery flagpole at 8:50 a.m.. Memorial Day is an appropriate time to become acquainted with the dignity, beauty, and historical richness of the AUMC cemetery which contains not just the gravesites of military veterans but also the final earthly resting places of many members of our church's founding families.

Following the cemetery tribute, Legion Post 1976 will lead a Memorial Day flag and community observance at 11 a.m. at the cannon in the triangle at the intersection of Columbia Pike and Backlick Road. At its conclusion, those in attendance are invited to visit the Legion Post Home located near the triangle for light refreshments.
