The youth of Annandale United Methodist Church will be celebrated and recognized on Youth

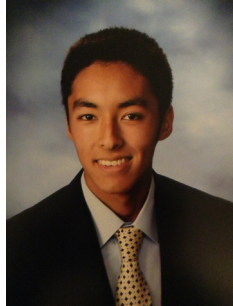
Sunday, June 9 (one service at 10:30 a.m.). Special congratulations go to AUMC young people who have or will soon be graduating from high school and college!

Vacation Bible School, June 24

AUMC's popular Vacation Bible School is scheduled for

June 24-28, from 9 a.m. – noon. The theme for this summer's VBS is "The Vine" from John 15: 5, "I am

the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing," with a concentration on the Fruits of the Spirit as named in Galatians 5: 22: "Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control".

During VBS, children will make gifts to share and crafts to take home that will remind them of the Fruits of the Spirit. Children will participate in 10 centers throughout the week with two scripture-focused story times each day, as well as music and themed snacks daily. The VBS service project will be planting vegetable gardens for the community at Safe Haven and raising money to furnish classroom space for children in Cambine, Mozambique. The overall VBS project is a trellis, bench, and vine for the courtyard. VBS Celebration is Sunday, June 30.
