All God's Children Camp, which partners with Virginia United Methodist
camps, is for children of incarcerated mothers and fathers. Three camps are
planned this summer, including one at Camp Highroad, which serves Northern
Virginia. Children ages 7 to 12 spend a week at camp, participating in activities
such as boating, swimming, hiking, archery, music, crafts, Bible study, and conflict
resolution. All God's Children Camp provides a week of sanctuary for children
who face many challenges in their lives: economic poverty; temporary living
conditions; loneliness; low self-esteem; violence; and drugs. The help of volunteers,
such as Rick and Judy Hampton, and donations make the camps possible. AUMC
has been a strong supporter of All God's Children Camp for years, and if you
would like to make a financial donation, please make a check payable to AUMC
with "All God's Children Camp" in the note line. One critical need is funding for
scholarships; \$350 send one child to camp, but any donation amount is welcome.

Donations are also needed for arts and craft supplies: adult blue jeans and
pop tops from drink cans (red, blue, or green pop tops, not the entire can). Boxes
for craft supply donations are near the coat racks by the Atrium. All donations are
needed by the **end of July**.

What's Going on Around Back? The AUMC Weekday Children's Programs
will begin renovating the toddler playground (closest to the Little White Church
and Child Development Center entrance) and resurfacing the preschool side top
playground the **week of July 29**. The toddler playground will have additional
smaller structures added to be more age appropriate for the toddler/one year
old children using the playground. New poured-in-place surfacing will be added to
that playground and to the upper preschool playground. This surface is much safer
for children who might fall down, is much easier to maintain, and pays for itself in
a few years in the time and money saved from re-mulching every year. It will be
exciting to have this ready for the start of school in the fall.

Help Provide Clean Water! AUMC's Earth and Spirit Group is working to
help provide safe drinking water to the people in northern Ghana, and you can
help, too. Around the world, 900 million people lack access to safe drinking water
and 2.5 billion have inadequate sanitation, leading to water contaminated with
deadly bacteria such as E.Coli. Every 20 seconds, a child dies of preventable water-
borne disease. AUMC's Earth and Spirit group is raising funds to purchase drinking
water filters for the people of northern Ghana. The goal is to purchase 25 filters,
at a cost of \$250 each, for a total of \$6,250. To make a donation of any size, make
your check payable to AUMC with "E&S water filter" in the note line.
The water filtration devices can provide clean, safe water for a family of four-six
people every day for more than 10 years. The fundraising campaign will continue
through the **end of October**, but donations are welcome now. Checks can be
placed in the offering plates or given to the church office. For more information,
