Convocation Sunday, Sept. 15



The Academy of Discipleship will hold its seventh annual Convocation on Sunday, Sept. 15. The Convocation Preacher is Rev. Dr. Youtha Hardman-Cromwell, Professor, Wesley Theological Seminary.

From the Latin words meaning “to call together,” Convocation serves as opening worship for our Academy year and an opportunity to bring together all adult classes for a time of joint learning during the Sunday school hour.

Dr. Youtha Hardman-Cromwell is an elder in the Virginia Conference of the United Methodist Church. She is a professor at Wesley Theological Seminary and previously served as Assistant Dean for Wesley Seminary at Mount Vernon Square and as Director of the Practice in Ministry and Mission Program.

Dr. Hardman-Cromwell received her Master of Divinity degree from Howard University School of Divinity and her Doctor of Philosophy degree from American University.

She has served the Virginia Conference as trainer on Churches in Transition Commission, chair of the Commission on Religion and Race, and ministry candidacy mentor. She is in ninth year of service on the Virginia Conference Board of Ministry. She has been a delegate to Southeast Jurisdictional conferences and General Conference. She is a writer, preacher, Bible Study leader, and resource person. She and Oliver have four adult children and one granddaughter.

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A Great Omission

"...teaching them to obey everything I commanded..." - Matthew 28:20a

Dear Friends,

We are excited to begin the seventh year of the Academy of Discipleship. Our theme continues to be "Connect, Grow, Serve."

This past Sunday, the pastors reflected on this theme as it relates to the Great Commission and our overall mission as a church. In this text, Jesus charged his disciples to go into the world to make disciples, to baptize them, and to teach them. (Matthew 28:16-20)

The Academy of Discipleship exists to fulfill this last command. Through classes, bible studies, small groups and guest speakers, we seek to teach all that Jesus taught, exemplified, and commanded during his earthly ministry.

Herein lies the challenge: To participate in a class or small group requires commitment. To teach a class or lead a small group requires even greater commitment. Both require moving beyond the Sunday morning worship experience into a smaller group for deeper study, fellowship, and accountability. Both require prioritizing discipleship over competing activities. Both require stepping outside of the comfort zone of anonymity in a large church to know and be known among fellow believers. No wonder a disproportionate number of our congregation, as with many churches, do not attend a class or small group.

Thus, the failure to attend Sunday school or small groups constitutes a great omission in the life of the believer. Sunday morning alone does not allow for the deeper learning and fellowship that enables believers to, not only hear the word, but apply it to their lives. Small group study and reflection, along with personal prayer and spiritual practice, are necessary to move beyond membership to discipleship.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, in his famous work, *The Cost of Discipleship* articulates this notion even more strongly. "Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate."

By contrast, "Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again and again, the gift which must be asked for, the door at which a man must knock. Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow, and it is grace because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ."

If the cost of discipleship is high, the cost of nondiscipleship is even higher. According to Dallas Willard, "Nondiscipleship costs abiding peace, a life penetrated throughout by love...hopefulness that stands firm in the most discouraging circumstances, power to do what is right and withstand the forces of evil. In short, it costs exactly the abundant life Jesus said he came to bring."

Friends, as your schedules begin to fill, I encourage you to commit to discipleship this year. Don't commit this great omission; rather let us recommit to the great commission to make disciples, baptize them, and teach them all that Jesus commanded.
