AARP Safe Driving Course for Seniors: Monday and Tuesday, **Oct. 28 and 29**, 10 a.m. – 3 p.m. (an hour off for lunch), Media Center. Those who complete the two-day course will receive a certificate to submit to their auto insurance company. This often results in a reduction of the insurance premium. Many insurers require you to take the course every three years to maintain the rate reduction. The cost is \$12 for AARP members (bring your card) and \$14 for non-members.
