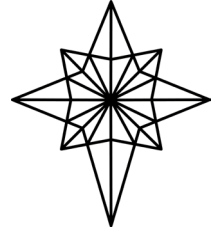

Carry Them All the Days of Old

Isaiah 63:7-9

*I will recount the gracious deeds of the LORD,
the praiseworthy acts of the LORD,
because of all that the LORD has done for us,
and the great favor to the house of Israel
that he has shown them according to his mercy,
according to the abundance of his steadfast love.*

*For he said, 'Surely they are my people,
children who will not deal falsely';

in all their distress.*

*It was no messenger or angel

in his love and in his pity he redeemed them;
he lifted them up and carried them all the days of old.*



Have you ever seen a movie several times? Or read a book for a second, third, maybe fourth time? We already know the punch line, the climax, the twists, yet we like to relive it one more time. Likewise, Isaiah writes, "I will recount the gracious deeds of the Lord." Isaiah believed in remembering how God's mighty hand was always at work in the world.

As we celebrate Christmas, this is the time when we come together and tell the stories of old. We gather our families, our friends, and even meet new people and sit for a while to hear the amazing story of the birth of Christ who was born to bring justice, peace, and joy.

I want to challenge you to do as Isaiah does and recount the times God's presence has been with you. This divine presence is a reality in our lives each and every day, not just in our Bibles or Sunday morning. The steadfast love of God is present, and just like Isaiah says, "It was no messenger or angel, but his presence that saved them."

Can you imagine how powerful this Christmas would be if we were mindful of all of our blessings, especially Immanuel—"God with us"? This invitation to participate in God's never ending love is to each and every one of us. "For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named

Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

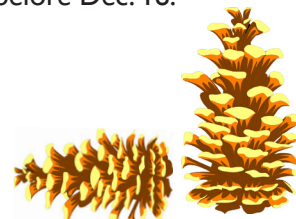
