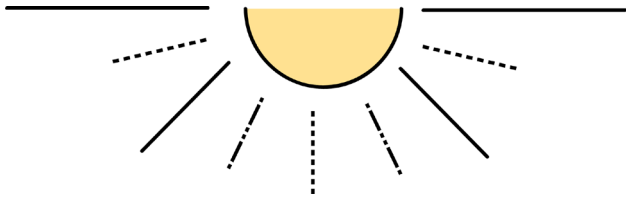

How Are We Doing?

Grace and peace in the name of our Savior!

It is our custom as we encounter each other to ask, "Hello! How are you doing?" Many of us respond, "I'm fine!" Some of us have crafted various humorous

responses, such as "I'm this side of the dirt," or "I'm fine for the shape that I'm in!"

We formulate these responses because either we don't want to rehearse a litany of how it really is with us or we feel that the inquirer doesn't really have the time or interest in hearing the same. The fact of the matter is that many of us are not well.

This is the focus of Eric Law's chapter on the currency of wellness in his book, *Holy Currencies: Six Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries* (St. Louis: Chalice Press, 2013). He describes wellness of the body as the interdependent functioning of several systems, with particular attention to the circulatory system, which brings needed nutrients to and carries used materials away from the cells of the body. The same principle of interdependence and circulation attends to communities of faith – the body of Christ.

"How do you know your body is not well? What are the external signs? What are the internal causes for the body not being well? These are the questions we ask in diagnosing the health of our bodies," Law says. "The other major part of wellness has to do with the cycle of work and rest—when we are awake, we are doing things, exercising and moving the different systems; when we are asleep, all the systems rest and restore themselves," he continues. In so saying, Law connects the currency of wellness of the body – individual and communal – to the biblical concept of Sabbath. Sabbath is the key to creating a sustainable healthy community and, in the Judeo-Christian context, they are commanded by God for the human community to follow.

The currency of wellness is the state of being healthy—physically, socially, economically, ecologically, and spiritually; both within your church or ministry, as well as in your neighborhood, town or city, nation, and the earth itself, especially as the result of deliberate effort. Sustainable wellness requires a regenerative and re-circulatory flow of material, human, financial, and natural resources.

Sabbath as prescribed in the Scriptures may not be

how we can take Sabbath today. So we need to find creative ways to take Sabbath. Sometimes it just means to stop and choose another path; take a break, find another way. Rest. Refresh. Renew.

As we continue to recast stewardship in a healthier, more holistic way, I pray for us all a more intentional path to wellness.

American Legion - AUMC Memorial Day Ceremony, Monday, May 26
