United Methodist Conference:

“Lord, Renew Us With Your Spirit”

Nearly 4,000 clergy and laity representatives of United Methodist churches across Virginia will gather at the Hampton Roads Convention Center in Hampton, Va., June 20-22 for the Annual Conference meeting of worship, mission projects, celebration of ministries and conducting the business of the Virginia Conference of The United Methodist Church. In addition to AUMC’s clergy, Delegates from AUMC include Kevin Sabo, Julie West, Elizabeth Moss and Janet Petty. The theme of the gathering is “Lord, Renew Us With Your Spirit.”

Bishop Young Jin Cho is the first Korean-American to lead the Virginia Conference and the first Korean-American elected bishop in the Southeastern Jurisdiction of The United Methodist Church. Among the items to be conducted during the Conference will be the ordination of new clergy; a memorial service to remember those who died since the last Annual Conference session; and the announcement of pastoral appointments to all the churches in the conference. Bible Study will be led by the Rev. Dr. Elmer Colyer, professor of Historical Theology and Wesley Studies at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary in Iowa and pastor of a United Methodist congregation. Conference preachers will be Bishop Robert Hayes of the Oklahoma area, Rev. Dr. Rhonda Van Dyke Colby, Dean of Student Life at Shenandoah University, and Bishop Cho.

Mission and service will be emphasized, with a worship service during which a special offering will be taken to support a variety of ministries, including Imagine No Malaria, a denomination-wide effort to end malaria in Africa; Cambodia church construction and Christian education; Mozambique lay leadership and communication training; Brazil Shade and Fresh Water program for street children; promotion of mission engagement of Virginia Conference small membership churches; Community Outreach Program

The Blessing of Place and Time

Grace and peace in the name of our Savior! I continue here with stewardship reflections I have gleaned from *Holy Currencies: Six Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries* by Eric Law. We have spoken of relationships and wellness. I would

offer here thoughts on the currency of time and place.

In introducing this currency, Law tells stories about his journey, particularly about a formative time in his college and seminary training when he was invited to be a part of a retreat. The spiritual invigoration he experienced led him to believe that the places the retreats inhabited were holy spaces, imbued with spiritual vitality. After becoming a staff person for one of the retreat centers, he quickly found out that it was not the place that was holy. It was the people and purpose that infused the events with the energy he experienced.

Law goes on to develop this thought by defining the currency as follows: "Currency of place" refers to the properties from which your church/ministry operates, and other properties owned by, or which can be accessed by, your church or ministry. "Currency of time" is the paid and volunteer time that leaders and members offer to the church or ministry, often engaging the currency of place. Churches are only poor when they do not utilize these two currencies effectively and faithfully.

Notice that the spatial dimension is not the only important thing in his discussion. In developing our currency of time and place we also need money and gracious leadership. Money is used to pay for the maintenance needs and improvement of the place. Money is also used to pay for staff time—both clergy and lay employees—to maintain the place and enable ministries in it.

We are blessed with both: a wonderful facility that engages the community for a wide array of holy purposes – housing the homeless, a staging place for feeding the hungry, providing safe space for the children in our community, providing a place for community conversations – and a people with a heart for God's mission. All of that is wonderful, but means very little if we don't continue with great intention. So, during this season of reflecting on stewardship, I ask you to reflect on the currency of time the Lord needs from you. It is worth pondering.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Disaster Response Team Called to NC: Eleven Disaster Response Team (DIRT) members, four from AUMC, responded to a call from UMVIM and the United Methodist Church in North Carolina to assist with disaster relief for residents in Chocowinity, NC, who were affected by a recent tornado. The team worked eight-hour days removing trees and debris from properties. Two team members were trained in chain saw usage and cleared the large trees. Other team members hauled debris and cleared items scattered by the tornado. Teams from local churches and South Carolina worked with us and the Salvation Army provided lunch. Our team assisted 6-8 homeowners whose property suffered significant damage. Several of the homeowners assisted in the cleanup and shared their stories and heartaches from the disaster. AUMC team members were Erin McKenney, James Rodriguez, Gary and Pat Sherfey. Our team was grateful that they were able to help begin the process of cleanup and rebuilding and thanks the congregation for its ongoing support and prayers for this ministry.
