Sowing God's Love

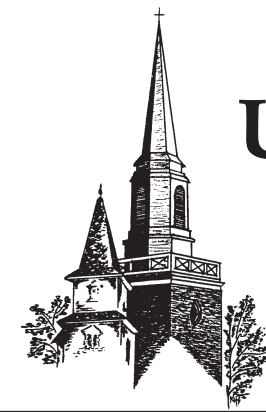
