All Saints Sunday is Nov. 2. On Sunday, Nov. 2, AUMC will celebrate All Saints Day. What is All Saints Day? United Methodists believe in saints, but not in the same manner as some other churches. We recognize Matthew, Mark, Paul, John, Luke and other early followers of Jesus as saints, and many United Methodist churches are named after these saints. United Methodists believe "... there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human who gave himself a ransom for all" (1 Timothy 2:5-6a). United Methodists call people "saints" because they exemplified the Christian life. In this sense,

every Christian can be considered a saint. John Wesley, co-founder of the Methodist Church, believed we have much to learn from the saints, but he did not encourage anyone to worship them. Wesley's focus was entirely on the saving grace of Jesus Christ.

On Nov. 2, AUMC will recognize and celebrate All Saints' Day and "all the saints who from their labors rest," by reading the names of AUMC members who died in the past year. Come and celebrate their lives!

The Currency of Money

Grace and peace in the name of our Savior! I write today the last in my offerings on Eric Law's book, *Holy Currencies: Six Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries*. The last coincides with our stewardship campaign, Consecration Sunday, which will culminate in our celebrating in worship that offering of our time, talents, gifts and service. I write last about the

Currency of Money for several reasons.

First, because to focus on money is to distort the holistic meaning of stewardship, something many churches are guilty of. The biblical sense of stewardship is to focus on our responsibility to care for things that are not our own. Knowing God to be the creator of all is to understand that we are to care for and use responsibly everything that God has given. Everything we have, are or will be are gifts from God.

Secondly, the focus on money usually is directed to the concrete things of the church: budget, building, staff and the like. This is a misdirected focus, taking us away from the spirituality of it, the need we have to align the resources God has given with our God given purpose.

In reflecting on this, Law returns us to the functionality of money, reminding us that in early societies money was not used. Bartering, the trading of goods and services that helped communities grow and thrive was the mode of exchange. There arose occasions and seasons, however, when what one had to trade did not coincide with one's neighbor's need. Some measure of exchange was needed. Money was born. Money was, in Law's words, "... simply a temporary medium of exchange... (W)e lost sight of the original purpose of money and decided to accumulate it as a commodity rather than keeping it moving as a medium of exchange." (*Holy Currencies: Six Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries*, Kindle Locations 3195-3197).

This movement toward the consideration of money as something to be acquired and accumulated – while important – can be transformed into something that we value more than our relationship with God. For some, money can become our god. Thus, as we collectively discern our commitment to giving, as we move to the consideration of holistic, biblical stewardship of everything generally and money specifically, I would echo here Law's foundational assumptions:

- God owns everything.
- God gives abundantly.
- We are not to keep God's resources; we are to circulate these resources.
- God's blessings are then recycled to create more blessings.

In the end, we will be blessed.
