Or feeling like we "missed the moment". Advent Conspiracy is a movement designed to help us all slow down and experience a Christmas worth remembering. Join the Advent Conspiracy!

"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

-- Matthew 1:23

Dear Friends,

The countdown to Christmas began several weeks ago. Retailers began selling Christmas decorations before Halloween, and many have been promoting pre-Black Friday sales since early November. According to the Wall Street Journal, holiday sales are expected to reach over \$488 billion. Those who defend this overly commercialized season argue that but for the holiday season, many businesses would not be profitable for the year. Unfortunately, retailers' efforts to put their businesses in the black leave many families in the red.

Families are stressed, strained, and in debt after the holiday season. There has to be a better way.

During this Advent season, we invite you to join the Advent Conspiracy. We invite you to opt out of the overly commercialized stress of the season and instead, spend time worshipping God, spend time with family, and engage in meaningful giving to help the poor and others in need. We invite you to commit to the four tenets of the Advent conspiracy: worship fully, spend less, give more, and love all.

It all begins with worship. The Advent story, in fact, is filled with worship. According to the Gospel of Luke, after Mary was visited by an angel, she went to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Mary worshipped God with her now famous Magnificat, saying "My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior...." After the birth of his son, John the Baptist, Zechariah worshipped God, saying "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them. He has raised up a mighty savior for us in the house of his servant David...." Similarly, the angels that appeared to the shepherds worshipped, saying "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" According to the Gospel of Matthew, wise men from the east found the Christ child and worshipped him, bringing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

In this Sunday's sermon, I will reflect on what it means to "worship fully." I will describe worship as not simply a weekly commitment, but a moment-by-moment way of living in God's presence. This season, I invite you to fill your spirits not your credit cards; to worship fully, spend less, give more, and love all. Perhaps then we can truly experience the presence of Immanuel, God is with us.
