SERVING FROM THE HEART

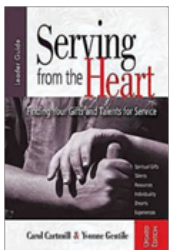
Finding Your Gifts and Talents for Service

Christmas Gifts



As the holiday season rapidly approaches and we prepare our hearts to welcome Christ, for many the air is filled not with joy and anticipation—but anxiety, apprehension, and stress. We are faced with the reality that the season requires so much of our time, so much of our strength, and yes—so much of our money.

The list of gifts seems to get longer and longer, or maybe you find yourself with shorter lists and bigger totals. Whatever the case might be, I hope you are taking time to reflect and ponder what's important to you and your loved ones this Christmas.

Many times we think that the bigger the price tag is, the bigger the thank you will be. But that's often not the case. Sometimes the intention behind our gift giving is what matter most.

I grew up in a household where, for many years, the lists for presents were modified from toys and gadgets to winter clothing and school supplies. Now, when you are a child and you get what you need versus what you actually want, you tend to feel let down. Our immediate reaction is to say not fair! Or we might even dare to think we deserve something better.

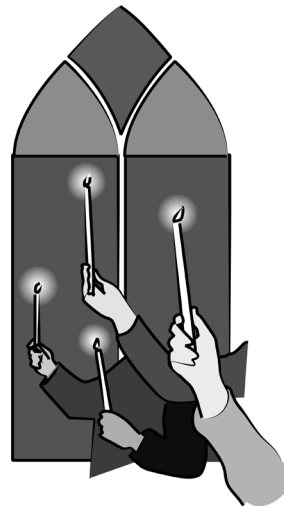
But is Christmas about what we deserve? Thanks be to God that we don't get what we deserve, but we receive what God gives.

This season, the prophet Isaiah commands our attention: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (9:6). In the midst of these hectic times, such social unrest, and the uncertainty of what's ahead in 2015, God gives us God's own self through Jesus.

This gift is not only another one of many, it's not just another present we put under the tree, and it's definitely not what we deserve. But what makes this

gift even more special is that it is one to be shared. We can invite and share a meal with that lonely person in the pew who we all see yet barely talk to. We can offer a smile and a hug to troubled faces we see day in and day out. We don't have to buy a gift to share Jesus with one another—we just have to be like Jesus.

Give of your time, share God's mighty acts with others, but most of all, remember that Jesus is the Prince of Peace who we can all rely on—not just this season but all throughout 2015. Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!
