Day of Prayer: Virginia United Methodist Bishop Young Jin Cho invites everyone to participate in a conference-wide Day of Prayer today for a renewal and revival of the churches in our conference and in the entire United Methodist Church.

Pentecost: Today is one of the principal days of the Christian year, celebrated on the 50th day after Easter. The Greek word pentecoste means "fiftieth day." Pentecost is the day on which the Christian church commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and others assembled in Jerusalem. It marks the beginning of the Christian church and the proclamation of its message throughout the world and is often referred to as the birthday of the church. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red, and you may notice that members of the choir and others in the congregation are wearing shades of red, orange and yellow today.
