"The Spirit is Moving" Campaign presentations, today and June 21 in the Sanctuary: The Trustees have developed and implemented much-needed improvements to the heating and air-conditioning ventilation system. To support this work, "The Spirit is Moving" campaign is underway to raise \$300,000 in financial commitments over the next two years, July 2015 through June 2017.
