Kairos Cookies: Warm up the ovens! It's that time! The Kairos Prison Ministry Team is preparing to share God's love again for the men at Greenville Correctional Center, **Oct. 15 – 18**. The Annandale UMC team members are responsible for providing 800 dozen cookies! Cookies are a tangible and meaningful expression of our love for the inmates. A cookie sign-up sheet, prison-approved cookie recipes, and instructions are on the table in the Atrium. Sugar-free and gluten-free cookies are especially needed. If you cannot bake cookies but want to make a donation for baking supplies, make your check payable to AUMC, designated for Kairos Cookies, by Sunday, **Oct. 4**.
