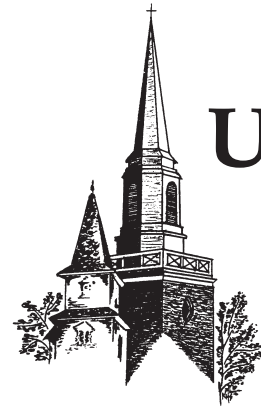

A Call to Pray for 2016 General Conference: General Conference, the top policy-making body of The United Methodist Church, meets once every four years to consider revisions to church law, and adopt resolutions on current moral, social, public policy and economic issues. It also approves plans and budgets for church-wide programs for the next four years. The 2016 General Conference will be **May 10-20** in Portland, Ore. The United Methodist Church has 131 annual conferences world-wide. The United Methodist Council of Bishops asked each conference to hold a 24-hour prayer vigil for General Conference. Virginia Conference Bishop, Young Jin Cho, selected **today, April 10**, for the Virginia Conference prayer vigil. AUMC's prayer time slot is from 9 to 10 p.m. and 11 to 12 midnight. Help blanket our delegates, bishops, and other church leaders with prayer as they prepare to listen to one another, discern God's will for the United Methodist Church and to make decisions that will guide United Methodists around the world in fulfilling our purpose.
