**Lenten Missions Update:** The Missions Committee would like to thank all those who generously gave to the Lenten Missions Project (LMP) this spring. To date, we have raised \$65,250 towards our goal of \$100,000. The funds will be used to support designated local and international projects, including ACCA, Poe Middle School, 100,000 Homes, Camp Highroad, Kairos, Stop Hunger Now, Brazil, Mozambique, and Haiti. Donations are still being accepted and will allow us to further our outreach to these groups. Make your check payable to AUMC with "Lenten Missions Project" in the memo line.

**All God's Children Camp** is a week-long overnight summer camp sponsored by the Virginia United Methodist Church for children (ages 7–12) of incarcerated mothers or fathers. The camps will take place at Camp Overlook in Keezletown (SE of Harrisonburg), **June 26 –July 1**, and Occohonock on the Bay, Eastern Shore, **July 31–Aug. 5**. The Virginia Conference seeks volunteer mentors (ages 17 and up). Mentor factsheets are in the church entranceway. The deadline for applications is **June 1**. All can help with prayers and donations for scholarships of any amount; \$400 sends one child to camp. Checks, made out to AUMC with All God's Children Camp in the memo, may be placed in the Sunday collection plate.

**AUMC is again sponsoring an adult mission trip** to Brenton, West Virginia (Wyoming County), **Oct. 23-29**, with the Appalachia Service Project (ASP). We will be doing relational ministry and home repairs—typical ASP projects include roofing, drywall and insulation, wheelchair ramps, plumbing, electrical, foundation repair, painting, stair and floor repairs. Cost for the trip: \$475 to include transportation, lodging, meals and construction materials. If you cannot go for the full 7 days (5 work days and 2 travel days), you are still welcome.
