Dear Friends,

Like many of you, I have been waiting for spring. Our winter was defined by a historic snowstorm quickly melted by sunny days, but the chill returned with weeks of rain. Temperatures grew warm then cool then warm again. We wore jackets longer than normal. And many people turned on their air conditioners and then had to pull out the winter blankets again.

Come to think of it, doesn't it seem that we spend a lot of our time waiting? The single are waiting to get married. The married are waiting to have children. Older parents are waiting for grandchildren. And young people can hardly wait to grow up. The employed are waiting for promotion. And if you live in this area, you can spend many hours waiting in traffic.


I remember learning a saying when I was young: "March winds and April showers bring May flowers." Flags and Honor at AUMC Memorial Day Weekend Ceremony, Sunday, May 29

During the Sunday school hour on Sunday, May 29, Annandale Methodist children, youth, and adult members will participate in the church's Memorial Day tribute. At the heart of the event is the ceremonial installation of American flags on the gravesites of the 37 veterans interred in AUMC Cemetery. At the conclusion of the 8:30 a.m. service, those who wish to participate in or witness the tribute will proceed to the cemetery. Those arriving later may join the procession from the atrium or meet it at the crest of the cemetery.

Upon arriving in the cemetery, those attending will witness the raising of the national colors and hear brief ceremonial words. Following this prelude, children, youth, and others will process through the cemetery and ceremonially implant flags on the gravesites of all interred military service veterans. After the flag placements, participants and witnesses will congregate at the flagpole for the playing of taps. Everyone is invited for fellowship and refreshment in Wright Hall following the ceremony.

Although bearing similarities in setting, ceremony, and memorial with the autumn observance of Veterans Day, Memorial Day is distinguished by serving as the solemn acknowledgement and singular official expression and observance of a nation's eternal gratitude for the ultimate in military sacrifice - the death in battle of American soldiers, sailors, airmen, and marines. The raising of the stars and stripes on the gravesites of AUMC's interred veterans is how church members and visitors bestow the deepest and most grateful recognition and honor they can summon to those who risked and gave their very lives for the sake of their country.

The verdant sublimity of the season makes Memorial Day weekend not just an occasion for recognition and remembrance but also an ideal time for people to experience the stone graven dignity, graceful natural beauty, and historical richness of AUMC Cemetery, which serves as the final earthly resting places of many members of our church's founding families.
