This Sunday was Exploring Annandale United Methodist Church – Children went on a visual scavenger hunt. While following the clues, they learned more about our church and history.

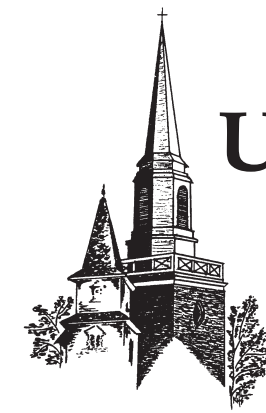
Child care is available during worship services for children infant through kindergarten age in the nursery rooms and during the Sunday School hour for children 3 and younger in Room 206.
