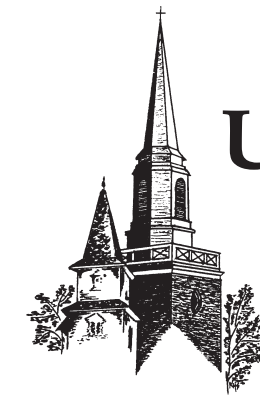

In the spirit of the season: In November, the AUMC Child Development Center and two weekday preschool and early learning classes contributed seven cartons of food to help stock the food pantry at our Mission Center. In December, CDC families and three preschool classes collected 81 pairs of mittens, 60 winter hats, 11 scarves and 14 pairs of socks for the Mission Center to distribute at Christmastime. We value teaching children about sharing and treasure the opportunity for them to learn about giving to others.

Bi-District Training Day: The United Methodist Church in Northern Virginia will conduct its annual Training Day on Saturday, **Jan. 7**, 8:30 a.m.–3 p.m., at Christ UMC in Fairfax Station. Mission opportunities in Brazil and Mozambique: Don Skillman, who has participated in and led UMC mission trips to Brazil, is planning a trip to the Boa Vista area in April. The work will occur **April 10-14**, with time on both ends for travel and sightseeing. The approximate cost is \$2,200. If interested, contact the office at 703-256-8330 or office@annandale-umc.org. Erin McKenney will be leading a team to Cambine, Mozambique, in **May**. The team will do some construction work, spend time with the orphans, visit the widows of Hanhane and meet the new missionaries in Chicuque and Cambine. A trip to Kruger National Park in South Africa is also planned. The approximate cost is \$3,200. If interested, contact Erin at hoopsfan1@verizon.net. A deposit of \$1,000 is due on **Jan. 15**.

Donations for Haiti mission trip: We are continuing AUMC's ongoing relationship with the Haitian people in Petit Goave, Haiti. Our next mission trip will be **Feb. 4–12**. Our team will be performing light construction as well as hosting a two-day Bible school program. As in past years, the team will be collecting supplies and asking for cash donations to be used in Haiti. The following donations are requested: 10 regulation-size soccer balls (deflated), two hand-operated air pumps, 10 Chinese jump ropes, 10 regular jump ropes 14' or 16' long (jump ropes available at Amazon), one 20-foot parachute (available at www.discountsschoolsupply.com), eight plastic beach balls to use with the parachute, stickers (anything child oriented) and 350 boxes of 8-count Crayola crayons (this box size and brand only). Place donations in the marked boxes in the atrium by Feb. 1. All cash donations will help purchase a snack and juice box for children attending VBS. For many, that will be their only meal of the day.
