## UPDATE ON IUMC MERGER

By now you should have received a letter from me, Richard Robinson, informing you about discussions of a proposed merger with Immanuel UMC. I appreciate receiving the numerous questions and comments that I have received, and the Council will do its best to respond to all of them. The purpose of this article is to provide additional background about why these discussions are occurring now.

No church wants to close its doors forever; however, our Christian brothers and sisters at IUMC have determined that could be a likely outcome for their congregation if they did not act. IUMC, with the assistance of the Alexandria District Office, examined a spectrum of options, from closing forever, to becoming part of a two-point charge, hiring a part-time pastor, or merging with another church of any kind.

None of these options was pleasant to the IUMC congregation; they are mourning the loss of their congregation's ability to continue on its own. IUMC decided that the best option for them was to merge with another church, and so they approached Annandale UMC with a request to consider a merger. It was not a notion that originated with the AUMC Council.

The AUMC Council is working very hard to examine the impact to all areas of our ministry and mission, but ultimately the decision will be made by you, the AUMC congregation and the IUMC congregation. Informational congregational meetings will be held in January and February prior to a decision-making church conference on February 26.

If the proposed merger is approved, we will endeavor to welcome and integrate the IUMC congregation and their ministry programs into our own. The IUMC assets will become AUMC assets. We will be one congregation on two campuses, and the AUMC staff will support activities at both campuses. We will continually monitor and evaluate the mission and ministry opportunities for both campuses.

If the merger is not approved, the District Office will determine which of the other less attractive options to take, and IUMC might survive for several years before it once again faces this decision. When a United Methodist Church closes, its assets are disposed of and the proceeds revert to the District office.

Many of you have expressed concerns about AUMC's ability to support two campuses; you are questioning why AUMC would agree to such a proposal. If it was only a matter of business planning, the decision would be easier; but it is a matter of extending the love of Christ to those who seek Him. And that is the basis for every mission and ministry we sponsor.
