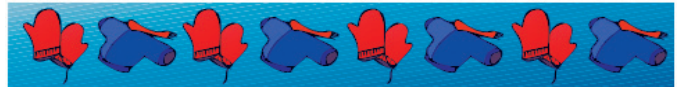

AUMC has again partnered with Bailey's Crossroads Community Shelter to provide a safe, warm place for local homeless men and women this winter. We will be opening our doors as one of several "overflow sites" and providing space in the Media Center on designated nights. Our December schedule is: Dec. 8, 9, 10, 20, 21, 27 and 28. We will also be hosting the homeless in January and March.



COLLECTION ITEMS NEEDED FOR HYPOTHERMIA RESPONSE

In support of our homeless guests who will be staying with us during the hypothermia response, we will be collecting the following items:

SOCKS, LONG UNDERWEAR, HATS, GLOVES SCARVES, \$5 GIFT CARDS FROM MCDONALDS OR BURGER KING ARE GREATLY APPRECIATED AS WELL.

The cards give a homeless person a "legitimate" reason to be in the restaurant, particularly on days with the day shelters are closed. Items can be delivered to the box at the hypothermia board in the atrium. Gift cards should be given to a member of the missions committee or left in the church office.
