Sunday, July 1, 2012 is a day that won't be forgotten soon by anyone who worshiped at Annandale United Methodist Church. All of us had experienced the recent storm whose violent winds had done great damage to the local electrical grid, and leaving several without power. Moreover, the mercury hovered around the 100 degree mark during those days, leaving those without air conditioning extremely uncomfortable. Surely, one might think, there would be no worship in the midst of such adverse conditions...or could there?

First, the staff, themselves with varying degrees of communicability, wrestled during the hours of Saturday, but at the end felt that this particular Sunday, the first of the new, merged community, was a very important opportunity that would not be repeatable. Second, due to the lack of ability to communicate widely, we were sure that someone would indeed show up and that we were obligated to be present as well. Third, it is this preacher's experience that these days - days of adverse conditions, bring out the best in us and allow us to focus on what is really important. So, in casual clothing, with windows wide open, we shared together our service of merger. It proved to be a God inspired decision.

A nearly full house arrived, much to everyone's surprise (except God, of course!). Rev. Young Choi played an inspired prelude. The choir, composed of singers from both communities, struck up a rousing processional hymn. The congregation, bereft of visuals, opened their hymnals and sang with gusto. The order of worship was led by the casually garbed clergy. Ice water was consumed liberally - IN THE SANCTUARY! Prayers were lifted. The anthem was beautifully rendered under the direction of Lynn Jennings. The

offering was given. The Gospel was shared. The bread of life was broken and shared, served by AUMC members paired with IUMC members, a portent of our shared mission to share Christ with each other and with others. There was truly a spirit of unity in the place.

The meaningful closing was brought to fore as members of both communities gathered before God's altar in prayer, concluded by Bill Sinclair ceremonially draping the clergy with a stole that had been given to IUMC clergy over the years, a sign of our acceptance of a shared commitment to bear the yoke of Christ, which as scripture points to, is easy, and it's burdens light.

And, despite the heat and discomfort of the environ, the new community walked with lightness of step and joy of heart as we together began the journey of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with the Annandale community at large. May God continue to order our steps as we venture forth.

Ephesians 3:14-21

Oogway: No, you just need to believe. Promise me,

Kung Fu Panda 2008

I have a confession to make, I really enjoy movies. I'm, however, not able to tell you who the director is or producer of a specific movie, nor am I able to give you the full cast of the movie. But one thing I'm really good at is remembering some really insightful and teachable moments. Kung Fu Panda is an animated

movie whose main character, Po, wants to learn kung fu. This character has no previous training on martial arts at all. But he is chosen by master Oogway to be the legendary dragon warrior. Shifu, who has been training kung fu for years, is not so convinced that Po can become the legendary dragon warrior as he us untrained, a little over weight, and a panda. Oogway tries to illustrate how Po can become the legendary dragon warrior. There is a line that mirrors Ephesians 3:17-19 in this dialogue: if you are willing to guide it, to nurture it, to believe in it. Paul is addressing the church at Ephesus and telling them to believe, to claim the power to comprehend the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge. Now, if we are willing to guide, nurture and believe plus we are convinced that we are rooted and grounded in love, imagine the things we can do.

Paul understands that we have been rooted and grounded in love. He understands that no matter what people try to do or how situations in life might affect us, we should not forget that we are loved. Therefore we must comprehend and share that love with others. How? Not just through words but through actions. Oogway knows that the seed of the peach tree needs to be cared for. Shifu on the other hand wants to control how and when. I believe that, sometimes, we want to control how and when we guide, nurture and believe when love will make a difference. We need to comprehend that the steadfast love of God is casting a wide net on the world. Not just for those who will accept it, but for everyone.

Therefore, let us not be like Shifu that believes in the illusion of control but let us believe that God's love can be nurtured and grown to dimensions that surpass knowledge. We just need to believe. Will you promise me that you will believe?

VIM Trip to West Virginia Oct. 21-27 2012



AUMC is sponsoring a 21-member mission trip to Brenton, West Virginia (Wyoming County) with the Appalachian Service Project (ASP). Brenton is only 340 miles from Annandale.

AUMC sent summer youth teams to ASP for over 10 years and, for the first time, we will participate in an adult mission. Our mission work will include: relational ministry and home repairs—typical ASP projects include roofing, drywall and insulation, wheelchair ramps, plumbing, electrical, building process, foundation repair, painting, stairs and floor repairs.

Cost for the trip; \$525 which includes transportation, lodging, meals and all construction materials. Volunteers who cannot go for the full 7 days (5 work days and 2 travel days) are welcome.
