4:30-32

In this passage, Jesus speaks about the kingdom of God and compares it to a mustard seed. Referred to as the smallest seed on earth it grows to a great shrub. Next time you are at the grocery store, go to the spice aisle and look for a mustard seed. Observe how small it is – does it resemble a great shrub to you?

The way I discern the mustard seed imagery and the kingdom of God is that it is our responsibility to grow it. How do we do this? By good actions, by giving someone a chance when most people won't, and to take time out of our day to plant a seed no matter its size. If we do these things God's word says we can expect a great shrub.

The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed—the smallest seed of all. Not a lot of people would take a second look at it if we saw it on the ground. But what if we did stop and take a second look. What if we take that seed and plant it? How can the kingdom of God be a real place of rest for those who are tired and hurt? Start planting the seed of the kingdom of God in those whom you encounter: friends, relatives, colleagues, and most importantly strangers. I know that if we take the time to plant the seed we can produce great shrubs for the kingdom.

AARP SAFE DRIVING COURSE FOR SENIORS (55 & over) - The AARP Safe Driving Course for Seniors is coming to AUMC again in June. Those who complete the two-day course will receive a certificate

to submit to their auto insurance company. This often results in a reduction of the insurance premium. The course will be held Monday and Tuesday, June 18 and 19, in AUMC's Media Center, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., with an hour off for lunch. The cost is \$12 for AARP members (bring your card) and \$14 for non-members. Since space is limited, you must register ahead of time by calling Jane Underhill (703-573-2056). If you get a machine, leave your name and telephone number, and we will confirm your reservation. No need to pay in advance. Pay on the first day of the course – cash or checks made out to AARP.
