## IT'S ANNUAL CONFERENCE TIME!

Grace and peace in the name of our Savior! Around the church there is an amusing saying; that is the fact that the church only has two seasons: getting ready for Charge Conference and getting ready for Annual Conference. We are in the latter of those two seasons.

We at AUMC are members of the Virginia Annual Conference, one of approximately forty such entities of the North Americas. The Annual Conference sends 1,000 delegates – divided equally between clergy and laity - annually to meet and study, worship, celebrate our common ministries and decide business matters. Our church will be represented by Julie West and Harry Day, in addition to our clergy.

The Conference will be held in Roanoke, Virginia on the dates of June 22 – 24, 2012. There we will hear great preaching from my friend the Rev. Dr. Steve Hundley, the District Superintendent of the Roanoke District; the Rev. Dr. David McAllister-Wilson, President of Wesley Theological Seminary; the Rev. Dr. Youtha Harman Cromwell, a professor at Wesley who has led one of our recent Women's Retreats; and last but certainly not least, our own Bishop Charlene Kammerer, who will be retiring as our Resident Bishop this year.

We will celebrate our common ministries by bringing clean up kits and layettes by the thousands; bag thousands of pounds of food for the hungry; as well as bringing an offering for our Initiatives of Hope – funding the ministries in Brazil, Mozambique and Haiti that we are so deeply engaged in. I hope that you will be generous as we collect our offering to take to Roanoke. We will also celebrate the ordination and

commissioning of a new class of Elders, Deacons and Certified Lay Ministers who will serve throughout the Commonwealth.



We will deliberate on the matters brought to us in the form of our conference budget, nominees for our Conference Boards and Agencies, and resolutions brought by members of the conference which principally have to do with issues of restorative justice.

I look forward to these times of reconnecting with friends and loved ones, as well as making new acquaintances. I am excited by the plans we have made for extending the Methodist witness into new communities and the new faith communities that are coming into being through our collective support that new people might know Christ. I commend to you the opportunities to see your brothers and sisters in Methodism at work together. It is how the church ought to be, and I am glad to be a small part of it.

**Forward by Faith and CFC Contributions:** Effective June 1, all remaining gifts designated for the Forward by Faith Capital Campaign or for CFC on your giving envelope will be credited to the Capital Repair and Replacement Designated Fund, which is used for current major facilities-related expenses by the Board of Trustees. Since January, when the bank loan for our 2009 Maintenance and Renovation Program was paid, any continuing Forward by Faith or CFC contributions have been credited to an endowment account to support future facilities related expenses. The balance in this account of approximately \$22,500 will be transferred to the Annandale UMC Foundation on June 1 to be managed for that purpose.

Third, I wish to thank our Administrative Council for their permission to tell the AUMC story. Our journey through the discernment process, our missional goal formulation, and our current efforts to live into what we have discerned provided a great deal of the substance of the project.

Fourth, I wish to thank our amazingly supportive staff. They all have contributed significantly to the effort by filling the space when I needed to read and write. They have reviewed and edited the work that I did. They gave constructive criticism and encouragement. They are the reason I delight in coming to work each day.

Last, I am amazed at the love that you have shown as I have completed the journey.
