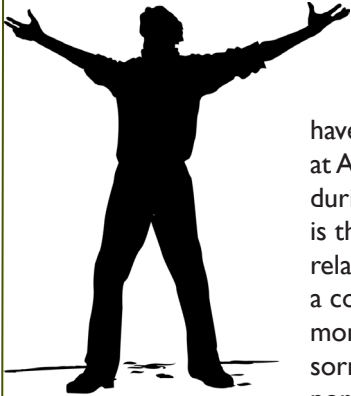

Name That Sermon!

One of the great gifts I have experienced during my time at Annandale that I was bereft of during my days as a Superintendent is the joy of being in an intimate relationship with the people of a community of faith; to share in moments of great joy and deep sorrow; to know the ethos, the norms and the stories of the

congregation that gathers faithfully on a weekly basis to worship God. While I enjoyed preaching and sharing with the many congregations I was blessed to supervise, the messages I prepared had to be more general in nature because of the lack of intimate connection. I could not speak to their situations because of that lack of connection.

As you might imagine, there is great joy in preparing a message to share with the community of faith called Annandale United Methodist every week. I enjoy the process of reading, studying, reflecting; trying to shape the message in such a way as to communicate an ancient story in contemporary but faithful ways. It is also a thing of great trepidation, seeking to find something engaging every week. A wise mentor called it "The relentless return of the Sabbath."

Your clergy and worship leaders, as they gather every week, seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit, wrestling with the question, "What do our people need to hear?" We use the lectionary – that regular and prescribed set of readings that the church at large reads together during the liturgical seasons of the Christian calendar. But it occurred to us at the table, "Why don't we ask what the people want to hear?"

The generative idea is that many come to services each week with deep questions about the Scriptures and how the Holy story intersects with our modern day experiences. It is also true that many have questions about issues of faith that they have not been able to have answered in satisfying ways. It is with that in mind that we will shortly be engaging a series

of sermons based on your suggestions. That series, "Name That Sermon," will run from May 5 through June 30. We have already had many suggestions; some amusing, some astounding. Whatever the case, we continue to solicit your thoughts and ideas for sharing with our worshipping community. We look forward to hearing from you!

Grace and peace in the name of our Savior!

As one studies the letters of the New Testament, one begins to gain a certain familiarity with epistolary style, form and function. There is the letter's beginning, usually identifying the letter's sender, recipient, greeting and a thanksgiving. Paul, the acknowledged author of many of the letters, makes effusive use of the latter part, commending those nascent Christian communities for their faith, their love, their embrace of the Gospel, and their efforts to emulate the things that Paul had modeled for them during his missionary visits.

I resonate and connect with Paul's deeply felt thanksgiving, for I am thankful to God for extending to me the grace of serving with the wonderful community of faith known as Annandale United Methodist. Although I do try to express it publicly in as many ways as I am able, those efforts pale in the presence of the ways that you live out your faith in our community and in the world.

Once again I have lifted the challenge of raising our vision in reaching out to God's world. You have once again responded with extravagant generosity, meeting and exceeding our mission goal of \$60,000. This means we CAN provide safe space for at risk children in Brazil; this means we CAN provide a place of study and preparation for rising clergy leadership in Mozambique; this means we CAN continue to feed hungry children at Poe Middle School; this means we CAN build shelter for children in Haiti; this means we CAN package thousands of meals for children around the world; this means we CAN provide home and hearth for a homeless person in Fairfax County. In a day and time when many wring their hands and say they can't, you have explicitly said, WE CAN.

I say to you, in the words of the apostle, "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ (Philippians 1:3-6)." Jesus said to his disciples – and to us – that we are to let our light shine, that others might see our good works and give glory to God in heaven. I ain't gonna wait! I'm praising God for you RIGHT NOW!

Hospitality Intake/Outreach REDUX

The mission of AUMC, “to make Disciples of Christ for the transformation of the World,” has a nice sound, but how can we achieve it?

I’m glad you asked! The answer is, “one smile at a time; one handshake at a time; one meal at a time; one mission trip at a time.”

For many, Sunday morning worship is routine: rushing to get kids to Sunday School, doing church business, promoting an activity, etc.; but to seekers or newcomers, our hospitality, smile, and handshake might just be what they need to start their journey to discipleship. For example, inviting a friend to participate in “Stop Hunger Now” transforms not only the anonymous person halfway around the world who gets fed, it transforms our friend and us at the same time. As we engage more community groups to participate in “Stop Hunger Now” at AUMC, we begin to transform Annandale.

You can help expand AUMC’s Outreach/Hospitality redux and continue your own discipleship journey by volunteering to serve as parking lot greeters, Welcome Desk helpers, ushers, “connect” members, and members of the refreshment committee.

Parking lot greeters are an important “first contact” for newcomers and can take a more active role by helping visitors find open parking spots, and directing regular members to further away spots.

Welcome Desk helpers greet newcomers as they come in; to expand our hospitality we will ask newcomers to return to the Welcome Desk/Coffee Café area after worship services, when they will be more receptive to making connections. While ministry committee members are key to this activity, we

will also recruit and train “connect” members, those with the spiritual gift of welcoming, to be particularly intentional about making a connection with a newcomer and helping them to find a small group or ministry area.

Ushers play an important role in welcoming newcomers, and they will be encouraged to be more active in making newcomers feel at home by escorting them to a seat and introducing them to regular members near them.

Finally, we hope to recruit a dedicated “refreshment committee.” This group will take responsibility for providing basic refreshments during fellowship hours which will free up ministry committee members to connect with newcomers assembled near the Welcome Desk/Coffee Café after worship.

Watch for future announcements about recruitment and training for these important welcoming activities. There is a place for everyone to serve. Your smile, your handshake, your words of welcome might be the beginning of someone’s discipleship; and it will begin your transformation!
