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Spiritual Skiing and a Life in HD

A few weeks ago the students of The Grid, the youth ministry of Annandale United Methodist Church, departed for their annual ski trip. However, this trip would not be anything like other ski trips. As students began arriving to the church awaiting their departure, the excitement and anticipation was evident. They loaded the vehicles and headed west...never to return the same.

Did you know that so many people "live" life each day with no consideration for what God's plan and purpose is for their life? They live a life that is dead. Even though they may be physically alive by enjoying time with family, friends and entertainment, their soul is lifeless and empty. Over the weekend, the students learned about the difference between a life like the one described above, Life in SD (Standard Definition), and a Life in Full HD (High Definition). In Romans 8 we see Paul talking about this conflict between living in the "flesh" and living in the "spirit." It was in this chapter that each student and adult spent time individually studying the word and

wrestling with the decision to live in SD or HD.

On Saturday we all hit the slopes. It was absolutely perfect weather for skiing and tubing! We could see the flurries of snow as we were swooping down hill after hill. Have you ever been skiing? There is something about seeing not only God's magnificent creation, but also this masterpiece covered in white fluffy snow. It really puts an individual in awe!

After a day on the slopes we headed back to the house for more time together and time with God. Saturday night we heard about what the Spirit does and how it is like a remote control. The Spirit leads us to something, but doesn't control the action. We were faced with the decision to either live a life for God where the Spirit leads us, or to live for ourselves and remain in control. We continued to learn that just because we decide to live a life in HD doesn't mean that it grants us all the details. We still hurt, get sick, feel lonely, and have questions. However, we choose to Pray...Trust...Obey...and Follow.

We ended the weekend reflecting on what is holding us back from living a life in FULL HD. See, the difference between a life in HD and a life in FULL HD is that a life in FULL HD holds nothing back. These

people are so determined that nothing will stand in their way and nothing will turn them away from pursuing God and His purpose for their life. Romans 8:38 shares that absolutely nothing will ever separate us from the love of God.

We want to say thank you to all of our supporters who helped make this trip possible. Thank you to all the adults who went on the trip who helped challenge and care for us. Thank you to our wonderful church family for your prayers and continual support. Thank you to our amazing God who deserves everything we are and everything we have.

This weekend will go down in our lives as a weekend that challenged us to grow. We grew in our relationships with our friends and adults. We grew in our relationship with God. We grew in our understanding of what it means to be a follower of Christ and pursuing a Life in Full HD!

Our Journey Through Lent

Matthew 26, Mark 14, Luke 22 and John 12. If you are wondering what those texts have in common, they are collectively the starting point in the Gospels that we have come to know as the stories of Christ's Passion. While technically the term passion stems from the Greek word for suffering, it is in truth the story of God's great love for us. Matthew 26, Mark 14, Luke 22 and John 12. These texts invite us to journey again with Jesus to Calvary.

Along the way, we will make several stops. Of course, we will make note of the plot twists in the story of salvation: Jesus' prediction of his death and resurrection and the disbelieving disciples; the conspiracy of the religious establishment; the anointing with costly perfume; the Last Supper and prediction of betrayal; the Garden of Gethsemane and the slumbering disciples; the identifying kiss and the cowardice and denial on the part of his friends; the mockery of justice followed by horrific scourging; the wounding journey and the old rugged cross.

We invite you to make note of those during our Lenten offerings: our Shrove Tuesday supper; our Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and, above all, our Easter Sunday services all are designed to help us reconnect with the depth and breadth of God's amazing love for us.

Brazil Mission Trip:

For the last seven years, AUMC has sent a mission team to Brazil as part of the Sombra e Agua Fresca Projeto ("Shade and Fresh Water Project"). Our teams have traveled to Sao Paulo, Fortaleza, Manaus, and Boa Vista. This year's team will travel to Belo Horizonte.

The Shade and Fresh Water Project is designed to create places for children with shade and fresh water. In Brazil, the children go to school year-round, but only for about four hours per day. As a result there are long periods of time where children are unsupervised. Issues like child prostitution and gangs have increased, exacerbating the need for supervision of the children.

The Methodist churches in Brazil created the Shade and Fresh Water Project to address these social issues, while also providing Christian education. Many of the construction projects involve building a classroom or daycare center at the church for the children to go to when they are in school where they receive supervision, Christian education, and a meal.

This year, AUMC's Mission Team's task is to add a second floor to an existing classroom building. The funds raised will pay construction materials and supplies. The team will be going from May 20-June 2.
