

Isaiah 60:1-2

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness is over the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory

Since this is a new area of ministry, a trial is planned in Northern Ghana to provide water filters for individual households. The Global Environment and Technology Foundation was created by Bob Herbst, an AUMC member and former Assistant Secretary of the Interior for the U.S. The filters cost \$250 each. Stamp Out Loneliness Totals: Thanks to everyone from the Annandale and Immanuel campuses who contributed to the "Stamp Out Loneliness" project for inmates in the Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women. The collection totals (higher than last year) are: 899 "Forever" stamps, 637 calendars, 886 note cards/envelopes, 2,322 Christmas cards, 941 assorted greeting cards plus other stationery, postcards, paper and envelopes. The goal of the project is that the messages in the letters and cards sent with these supplies will strengthen ties to home and lead to healing and reconciliation.
