FEEDING THE HUNGRY IN OUR OWN NEIGHBORHOOD?! Did you know that many of our neighbors rely on the ACCA food pantry to feed their families? Last week, 33 Annandale families received food from ACCA – and more food is needed. Just this week as part of AUMC's Jr. Kids In Mission program, rising 2nd- 3rd graders participated in a "great supermarket race" and were able to stock the shelves of the ACCA pantry with \$250 of food purchased during the "race".

Next Sunday, Aug. 5, the children's Sunday School class will take food to the ACCA pantry donated by our AUMC family. Donations needed!
