 **Lenten Study 2013** will be based on the book *The Jesus I Never Knew* by Philip Yancey. The book examines three fundamental questions: who Jesus was, why he came, and what he left behind. Yancey probes the culture into which Jesus was born and grew to adulthood; his character and mission; his teachings and miracles; his legacy--not just as history has told it, but as he himself intended it to be. The study book can be purchased at the Lenten Study table in Wright Hall before/after Sunday worship. Readings begin Feb. 3 and the sermon series begins Feb. 10.

 **Ordinary People, Extraordinary Lives!** The final sermon in the series about the Disciples is scheduled for Feb. 3 and will be about Barnabas.

Alleluia Chains: During Lent we don't use the word "alleluia". Lent is a penitential period, and the church signifies that by removing some of the most joyful hymns with the word "alleluia". Joy increases at Easter and "alleluia" returns. At the Shrove Tuesday pancake supper (Feb. 12), children will make an alleluia chain. Each link of the chain will say "alleluia" and carry a message about what brings them joy. Members of the congregation, as well as the children, are invited to make a personalized link. Look for a table in Wright Hall (or the atrium) on Sunday to inscribe your link. The "alleluia" chain will be "buried" and then raised up on Easter.

AUMC's New Member Class will meet on Friday, Feb. 1, 7-9 p.m., in room 209. The class is called "Brownie Evenings with Brown" and will be taught by Rev. Dr. Clarence Brown, Jr.. It is a time of exploration and discernment of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ at Annandale UMC.
