Lenten Study 2013 will be based on the book *The Jesus I Never Knew* by Philip Yancey. Winner of the Gold Medallion Book of the Year Award, *The Jesus I Never Knew* examines three fundamental questions: who Jesus was, why he came, and what he left behind. Yancey probes the culture into which Jesus was born and grew to adulthood; his character and mission; his teachings and miracles; his legacy--not just as history has told it, but as he himself intended it to be. Yancey concludes, "Jesus has rocked my own preconceptions and has made me ask hard questions about why those of us who bear his name don't do a better job of following him."
